Edmonton, AB, November 19, 2022 – The Alberta College of Family Physicians (ACFP) is pleased to announce Edmonton physician, Dr. Marjan Abbasi, as Alberta's Family Physician of the Year for 2022. Recipients of this prestigious award are chosen by their peers in recognition of their significant contributions to the health and well-being of their communities, dedicating themselves to the education of future generations of family doctors, and for providing exceptional care to their patients.

"To put it simply, Dr. Marjan Abbasi is an outstanding leader. Marjan is a strong advocate for her patients and their families. She has personally developed high functioning primary health care teams that are skilled in supporting older adults with complex health and social needs in various clinical settings," said Dr. Sheny Khera, long-time colleague of Dr. Abbasi. "She mentors the next generation of health professionals as a clinical faculty advisor for medical students, residents, and allied health members. Marjan is a compassionate, creative, charismatic person who always gives 110% in everything she does."

Dr. Marjan Abbasi is a family physician with extra training in Care of the Elderly. She is the Site Lead of the Geriatric Program at the Misericordia Hospital in Edmonton and an Associate Clinical Professor in the Division of Care of Elderly, Department of Family Medicine. The focus of her practice (both as a family physician and as a consultant in areas such as inpatient, outpatient, and assisted living) is the care for older adults living with frailty. She is happily married and a mother of three children. She enjoys learning new languages and interacting with people of diverse backgrounds.
